## **Who is teaching?**

**Grant Smith, Chairman of Hand in Hand Charity** and CEO of Hand in Hand Trading. These organisations aim to support children in East Africa and South America through education, welfare and clean water and create sustainable income. He is also the author of *Game of 2 Halves*.

**Antony Billington, Head of Theology, LICC.** Anthony’s role is to develop the biblical and theological breadth and depth of the LICC team in their ongoing work with Christians, churches and church leaders. He previously taught Hermeneutics and Biblical Theology at LST.
